Purpose Driven Disciples

Apostle Paul noted in Acts 13:36 that David "served God's purpose in his own generation" (NIV). In order to align yourself with God's purpose for your life, ask yourself some simple questions and be honest in your answers.

What matters most to you? Search your heart, read God's Word, pray, and spend time in the area of service or ministry that you most care about. If you still lack clarity, ask a few trusted godly friends for their input.

What do you want your life to count for? View your life purpose from an eternal perspective. Then, ask God to make your life count, not only in familiar things but also in new ways that you never could have imagined.

As a disciple of Jesus, make discovering and pursuing your purpose a priority.
